Get Involved.

Volunteer! It's a great way to have fun, meet new people and get to know your neighbours.

You don't need special superhero skills to be a Neighbourhood Watch Block Captain or volunteer, just a genuine interest in learning about how to protect your home and property and those of your neighbours. The Neighbourhood Watch program helps develop communities that care and residents who watch out for each other. Show your community that you care. By volunteering for our Neighbourhood Watch Program you will have an opportunity to help make your community a better place to live.

Remember to welcome new neighbours and to share information about the Watch program. Ask if they would like to be involved. If they agree, add them to the list of participants and ask them to share their address, phone numbers and email address with other participants. Include names of family and friends who have keys.

BLOCK CAPTAIN: A Block Captain is responsible for communicating with 10 – 15 homes within their Watch Neighbourhood, specifically the block on which they reside. They also distribute newsletters and may help plan informal annual neighbourhood gatherings.

BLOCK WATCH GATHERINGS: Neighbours are encouraged to organize an informal gathering at least twice a year to get reacquainted and to renew their commitment to watch out for one another.

TRAINING: One 1 ½ hour training session will take place each month at a different location. Please check www.thesafetyvillage.ca for upcoming dates. All Block Captains must attend one training seminar in order for the Watch to become active.
